 - The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) provides federal block grant funds to states that administer a Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). The benefit program year begins July 1, 2024. An FFY 2025 state plan is necessary to delineate the program benefits, eligibility criteria, available emergency/crisis assistance, and other policy in the Energy Assistance Program (EAP), administered by the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services, and the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP), administered by the Housing Division. States must submit a State Plan to DHHS annually, which serves as an application for funds.
 - A. The LIHEAP State Plan draft with the proposed changes will be available for review on the Division's website at http://dwss.nv.gov no later than five days before the Public Hearing. The following is a summary of the proposed changes:
 - The program year and other relevant dates will be updated throughout the document.
 - Minor text changes intended to clarify existing policy have been incorporated throughout the document.
 - The minimum annual payment will be changed from \$240 to \$360 throughout the document.
 - Under Section 5.1 Designate the income eligibility threshold used for the Weatherization component: changed the eligibility guidelines to follow the Department of Energy (DOE) eligibility guidelines and allow the eligibility threshold to be 200% of poverty instead of 150% of poverty to align the eligibility thresholds for the Weatherization Assistance Program.
 - Under Section 5.7 Do you have additional or differing eligibility policies for: The proposed verbiage is:
 - If utility usage is unable to be verified for the applicant, the household is not eligible to receive Weatherization services.

4. **For possible action:** Discussion and possible adoption of the FY 2025 Nevada Fund for Energy Assistance and Conservation State Plan—Maria Wortman-Meshberger and Tamera Saida

The Nevada Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Welfare and Supportive Services, and the Department of Business and Industry, Housing Division are required under Nevada Revised Statute 702.280 to jointly establish an annual plan.

- A. The Nevada Fund for Energy Assistance and Conservation State Plan draft with the proposed changes will be available for review on the Division's website at http://dwss.nv.gov no later than five days before the Public Hearing. The following is a summary of the proposed changes:
 - The program year and other relevant dates will be updated throughout the document.
 - Minor text changes intended to clarify existing policy have been incorporated throughout the document.
 - The minimum annual payment will be changed from \$240 to \$360 throughout the document
 - Under Section 8.1.8: The proposed verbiage is: Households with a solar vendor who
 meet the income criteria may be eligible for a fixed annual credit of \$360 for that
 vendor unless they have had solar for at least 9 months and have a higher energy
 burden.

Entities Financially Affected:

Nevada Revised Statutes, Chapter 702, established a Universal Energy Charge (UEC), which
utilities collect from retail customers of electricity and natural gas. These funds are collected by
the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada (PUCN) and deposited in the Nevada Fund for Energy
Assistance and Conservation. Up to 3% of UEC monies collected may be retained by the PUCN
for administration costs; the remainder is distributed to the Division of Welfare and Supportive
Services (75%) and the Housing Division (25%).

The PUC estimates \$14.6 million in UEC revenues for SFY 2025.
