New text incorporating revised federal regulations and state policy: Removes the possibility of parole as a condition for closing a case when the NCP is incarcerated for duration of the child's minority. Clarifies a case may be closed when the NCP's incarceration extends past the child's emancipation. Adds requirement that a NCP must have no income or assets above the "subsistence level" for a case to be eligible for closure. New policy defining "subsistence level" as the federal poverty guideline for the purposes of case closure. Authorizes case closure when the children are emancipated, and the NCP has entered long-term care and has no income or assets subject to seizure. New policy mandating case closure when the NCP's sole source of income is Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payment or concurrent SSI and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits.
